Teaching and Tomorrow URiM^{*} Scholarship Program 2023

The Pediatric GI Teaching and Tomorrow Program of the North American Society for Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition (NASPGHAN) strives to attract stellar residents to consider subspecialty training in pediatric gastroenterology, hepatology, and nutrition. All participants in Teaching and Tomorrow attend 3 tailored career panel discussions/sessions in addition to a very popular social networking reception, where they are invited as a group to meet with current fellows, as well as program director representatives from most GI fellowship programs in North America. Through these tailored and one-on-one meetings, we share our enthusiasm and guidance for careers in pediatric gastroenterology, hepatology and nutrition.

NASPGHAN is committed to being as diverse, equitable and inclusive a society as possible and has recognized the power of the Teaching and Tomorrow Program to bring promising pediatric residents of all races, ethnicities, genders, and social backgrounds from all over North America to our NASPGHAN Annual Meeting to see first-hand the cutting edge basic and clinical science of our subspecialty.

We have expanded the Teaching and Tomorrow Program to provide up to 15 scholarships to interested 1st and 2nd year pediatric residents and 4th year medical students who self-identify as Underrepresented in Medicine (URiM*). In addition to networking with other participants while attending the program's scheduled sessions, scholarship awardees will be matched with a NASPGHAN fellow and/or attending physician (often themselves a Teaching and Tomorrow Program alumnus) who will serve as an additional professional contact and NASPGHAN ambassador.

SUPPORT

URIM Scholarship Applications will be awarded on a rolling basis through August 1, 2023.

ELIGIBLE

All North American 4th year medical students and 1st and 2nd year Pediatric Residents with an interest in pediatric gastroenterology, hepatology and nutrition who self-identify as Underrepresented in Medicine based on the definition below (URiM). Residents applying to fellowship in the summer/fall of 2023 are not eligible to participate.

*The following racial and ethnic groups have been shown to be underrepresented in biomedical research:

American Indian or Alaska Native. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.

Black or African American. A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa

Hispanic or Latino. A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race. The term, "Spanish origin," can be used in addition to "Hispanic or Latino."

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.
