Issues I consider to be priorities for our members include:

- Establishing benchmarks for clinical productivity expectations for pediatric gastroenterologists, and corresponding compensation
- Establishing appropriate levels of ambulatory support (MAs, Nurses, RDs etc.) for physicians in clinic and endoscopy units
- Creating opportunities for trainees to improve endoscopic skills in less common procedures such as therapy of GI bleeding, polypectomy, enteral catheter placement and stricture dilation
- Advocating to improve insurance reimbursement and perceived value for pediatric specialty care

In addition to serving as a medical director and division chief at a large center for the past 14 years, my relevant experience for this role includes sitting on the Endoscopy and Procedures Committee and later serving as the liaison for this committee to the Executive Council. I have also served as President of the Medical Staff at Children's Dallas and served as faculty or director at multiple NASPGHAN courses and conferences.

If elected, I will advocate for the needs of our diverse membership and work to foster initiatives to support members at all career stages. This platform is an opportunity to amplify the voice of the NASPGHAN membership, and I would be honored to represent this community and contribute to the impact we make as a team. I feel that my experience and personal characteristics are well suited for the position of Councilor.
