I am honored to be considered for the position of Councilor-at-Large for NASPGHAN. Over the past 15 years, NASPGHAN has been my primary professional home—a source of inspiration, collaboration, and growth. I remember attending as a fellow, being amazed that my faculty knew so many pediatric GI's nationwide, and seeing their joy when meeting with old friends. **This** was a community I wanted to be a part of. Now, just a few years later, I have found in this society a community with a strong sense of camaraderie who shares my deep commitment to excellence in our field.

I currently serve as Section Head of Hepatology and Liver Transplantation and Director of the Pediatric Solid Organ Transplant Center at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. I have remained engaged in leadership and education across the field through national organizations, including SPLIT, AASLD, and UNOS. Within NASPGHAN, I have been privileged to serve on the Advocacy and Clinical Care & Quality Committees and most recently as Chair of the Hepatology Committee (2021–2024).

As Chair, I led the development of the **NASPGHAN Hepatology Bootcamp**—a first-of-its-kind, free, immersive, case-based learning experience designed to support early-career providers and fellows managing pediatric liver disease. The bootcamp brought together trainees, junior faculty, and expert mentors in a collaborative learning space providing: high-quality education, mentorship, and shared purpose with a focus on early career physicians

If elected, my vision is grounded in three priorities:

- **Supporting Early-Career Professionals**: Is this a good job? Is it fair? Common questions from trainees and junior faculty who often need guidance beyond their own institution. I would advocate for structured 1:1 mentorship programs, expanded networking opportunities, and inclusive leadership pathways to support the next generation of NASPGHAN leaders.
- Advocating for Pediatric Specialists Amid Medicaid Cuts: This poses a real risk to access
 and equity in pediatric subspecialty care. NASPGHAN must be a strong, visible voice in national
 policy discussions—defending the value of pediatric GI expertise and protecting reimbursement
 models that sustain our field.
- Engaging Community-Based Providers: A significant portion of pediatric GI care is
 delivered outside of academic centers. I aim to foster deeper integration of community
 gastroenterologists into NASPGHAN's initiatives—through accessible CME, committee
 representation, and research collaborations—ensuring the society reflects the diversity of our
 practice environments.

The opportunity to invest in people—whether through mentorship, policy advocacy, or building bridges is my driver. Many of the fellows and junior faculty I've mentored now serve as transplant directors or academic leaders in their own right. Their success underscores the power of meaningful support at critical moments. I want NASPGHAN to be that support system for others.

The Councilor-at-Large role is a platform to connect, listen, and lead with intention. I am committed to bringing energy, transparency, and humility to this role, and to advancing a vision of NASPGHAN that is inclusive, dynamic, and future-facing.
