In the end, it is our professional ethics that sets us apart from all others.

Repeatedly, in my interactions with attorneys, insurance companies, administrators and government officials, they have observed that Pediatricians are ethically unique among the professions. The role of Chair of the Ethics Committee seems to be ideal for allowing my education, experience and training to assist in our professional mission.
