



NASPGHAN FOUNDATION ABBOTT NUTRITION ADVOCATE AWARDS
Submission Deadline: August 1, 2026

Description

The Abbott Nutrition Advocate Awards are given by the NASPGHAN Foundation to members who have demonstrated dedicated effort and excellence in promoting increased advocacy and interest in pediatric nutrition in one or more of the following areas:

- Delivered improvements in care for infants and children through implementation of nutrition services within their practice;
- Advanced the wellbeing of infants and children through delivery of nutrition services to the community;
- Developed or implemented a nutrition education/management program within their practice/office to improve the health of infants and children; and/or,
- Demonstrated involvement in nutrition by spearheading a new project, initiative, or research project.

These awards will be presented at the NASPGHAN Annual Meeting in San Diego, CA. Three awards will be given with one award for each discipline (1 NASPGHAN member, 1 CPNP member, and 1 APGNN member).

Eligibility

Currently practicing clinically in the care of pediatric gastroenterology patients in North America. Be a NASPGHAN, APGNN, or CPNP member in good standing for a minimum of six months prior to the nomination. The NASPGHAN Foundation will award a \$500 travel stipend reimbursement for the CPNP and APGNN award recipient.

Application Details

The primary nominators should upload the following:

1. Their primary nominating letter should include details of the clinician's work with documented results/outcomes of progress/completion.
2. Up to two supporting letters
3. Nominee's complete curriculum vitae

Review Procedures

The Nutrition Advocate Awards Review Committee will review all active nominations and make recommendations to the NASPGHAN Foundation Board who will make the final decision regarding the recipients. The Nutrition Advocate Awards Review Committee is comprised of a multi-disciplinary set of members with interest and expertise in pediatric nutrition.
